# MONEY DEPT.

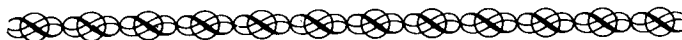

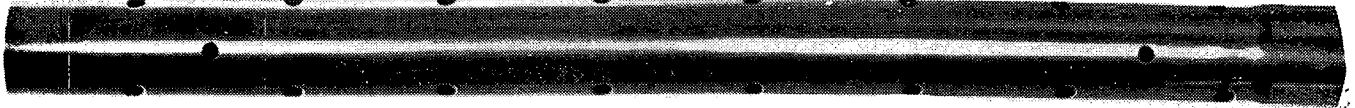

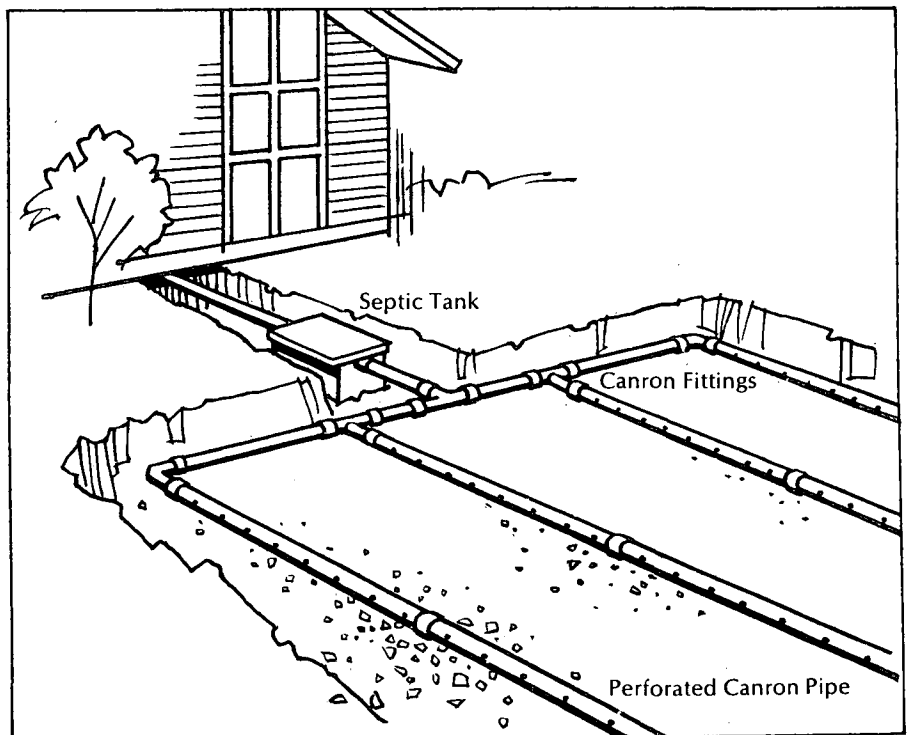
## 3 HOLE PVC DRAIN PIPE

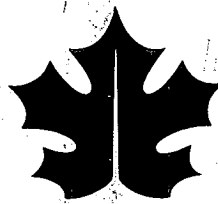
